Donna Uchizono Company (DUC) is a contemporary dance company formed in 1990 by Artistic Director Donna Uchizono to create and present works for the public. DUC's mission is to provide support for the creation of innovative contemporary dance, maintenance of existing repertory, and engagement with the community through live concerts, teaching residencies, lecture/demonstrations, and outreach programs. Donna Uchizono is widely recognized for her innovative movement language, distinctive wit, rich invention, and critically acclaimed choreography by many awards and grants. In addition to its contributions to New York City's cultural community, DUC has been presented throughout the US, Europe, Australia, Asia, and South America. DUC offers an expansive vision imbued with passion, foresight, openness, rigor, and a dedicated commitment to the performing arts.

# WHO'S WHO IN THE COMPANY

**DONNA UCHIZONO** (*Artistic Director*) is the Artistic Director of Donna Uchizono Company which has toured throughout the United States, Europe, South America, Asia and Australia. Uchizono has created work for notables Mikhail Baryshnikov, Pulitzer Prize Winning Playwright Paula Vogel, MacArthur Fellow David Hammons and neurologist/writer Oliver Sacks. Donna Uchizono is a 2016 United States Artist Fellow and has been recognized by many awards including a 'Bessie' Award, Alpert, Guggenheim, MAP Fund, National Dance Project, National Endowment for the Arts, New York State Council on the Arts, Creative Capital Foundation, the Jerome Foundation and New York Foundation for the Arts Fellowships among many others. Uchizono is a member of the Artist Advisory Board at Danspace Project at St. Mark's Church, where she was a founding member and Chair. **BRITTANY ENGEL-ADAMS** (*Dancer*) attended the Alvin Ailey School and was the recipient of the Oprah Winfrey Fellowship. She has danced under scholarship with Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, The Dance Theatre of Harlem, TheKirov Ballet, and The Joffrey Ballet School. **NOLA SPORN SMITH** (*Dancer*) is a dance and theater artist from Brooklyn, New York. She received her B.F.A in Dance from the University of Michigan.
